For those who either missed it or didn’t know about it, please go to < to find out all about the ride, US-129, 318 curves in 11 miles with a 900 ft. elevation differential. Here’s the plan:

Thursday, Oct. 19th - Depart New Orleans, picking up more “Dragon Slayers” enroute.

We will spend the night in Chattanooga, TN, at the Holiday Express, I-24, Exit 174. Reservation phone number is: 423-424-0125. Tell the reservation agent you want a room in the “TCCCL” block.

### National Corvette Museum Visit / Club Brick Unveiling

We will be driving up on Thursday, July 13, 2006, checking into the hotel, departing on Sunday, July 16, 2006, checking out the hotel. Baymont Inn & Suites From I-65, take Exit 22 North to Three Springs Rd. 165 Three Springs Rd. Bowling Green, KY 42104 (270) 843-3200 15 King rooms have been reserved. They are \$69 per night plus tax, which includes a full continental breakfast each morning. Parking in front and back, and they will provide hoses and cleaning stuff to clean the cars in the hotel parking lot. They will also give us use of their "Corvette" meeting room, free of charge for the duration of our stay.

To make your reservations, ask for block "**Northshore Corvette**" when you call in. Be sure to give your credit card info to confirm your reservation. Everyone will get a King room, unless you specify that you would prefer 2 double beds, and be sure to request Smoking or Non-Smoking. After July 1, 2006, any rooms not confirmed with a credit card will be released.

Some other info: Friday morning, July 14, we will tour the Assembly Plant at 10:00 am. The cost will be \$5 per person. I have reserved the tour for 30 people. ## National Corvette Museum Delivery Experience

I recently had a great experience I would like to share. I was asked by Joe Mesa to travel with him to Bowling Green, KY to pick up his newly finished and ready for delivery, 2006 Victory Red Z06 Corvette. For those of you unfamiliar with a "Museum Delivery", it is an option available with any new Corvette which has the Corvette shipped to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY just across the street from the Corvette assembly plant. The Museum then details the car and performs all of the normal dealer preparations. The owner is given a date and then travels up to Bowling Green to spend some time with the newly minted Corvette. The experience is well worth the time and cost as the museum folks really put out the red carpet for corvette owners.

The car is placed in a special display in the museum so that when the owner arrives, the car is presented with some fanfare. There is even a web camera focused on the new car which allows anyone on the Internet to view the delivery process. During this day at the museum, the owner is given a VIP tour of the assembly plant and is given a personal overview and detail operation instruction on the new corvette. After all of the paperwork is complete, the owner is given several gifts including a two year membership to the museum, a commemorative plaque with the car info and owner info engraved and an applied decal which identifies the car as having been delivered at the museum. (This should be interesting to see how this is handled in the future judging of such a car as the museum is handled as an extension of the assembly plant across the street.)

The Z06 that Joe and I were picking up was ready as advertised and the museum personnel spent a good amount of time going over all of the car's features which, since Joe had bought the car with all of the options, took some time. After all was said and done, we brought the car outside to the front of the museum for pictures and the gift portrait which the museum gives the owner. I will say that the new Precision Red Z06 sparked a lot of interest at the front of the museum with Joe being asked several times to allow other visitors to be photographed with his car.

During this time an interesting thing happened, Joe found a small defect in the passenger air conditioning vent. The museum folks took the car back across the street to the assembly plant and had the car repaired by the plant personnel that built the car. This sequence of events brought to mind the NCRS Judging rules which set a configuration as delivered from the factory. So in this case, if the car was changed, which time would be the factory delivery?? A good question I think.

After all was said and done, Joe and I drove the Z06 back to New Orleans from Bowling Green. I was able to drive it for over 400 miles and I had a grin on my face for the whole time. I would recommend this process for anyone getting a new corvette.

Did I say new Corvette? By the way, the museum offers this service for any corvette even one you already own. It can be brought to the Museum, detailed and treated as a new car. There were several in the Museum when we were there. I saw a 1954 and a 1967 going through the process. It does cost some money but the perks are worth it.

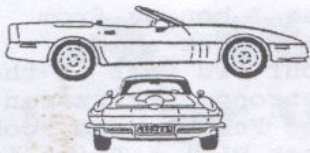

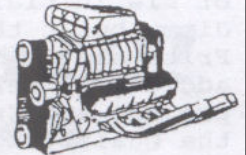

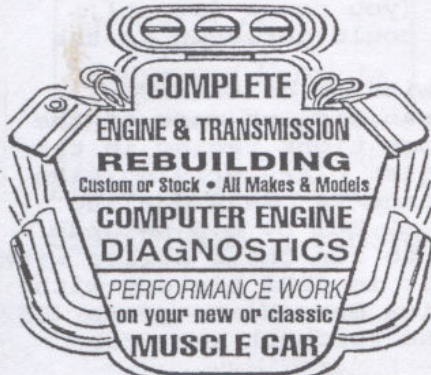
